

National Tsing Hua University International MBA (IMBA) Program Graduate Student Advising Fee Regulations

Approved at the 4th meeting of College of Technology Management
affairs meeting for the 2021 academic year on March 9, 2022

Article 1 In order to encourage more faculty members to advise students in our IMBA program (hereinafter referred to as the “Program”) to write papers in English, these Regulations are established.

Article 2 Subsidy Criteria:

- (1) One advising graduate student shall be subsidized NT\$5,000 (same below), and each graduate student shall be subsidized only once.
- (2) If a graduate student changes his or her advising professor during the thesis writing process, the graduate student advising fee shall be paid to the professor who was their advisor at the time of degree examination application; no other professor who has advised the student shall be paid.
- (3) If a graduate student is co-advised by two advising professors, the graduate student advising fee shall be split evenly between the two.
- (4) Subsidy recipients shall only be faculty members who have advised graduate students in the Program; students who have received scholarship assistance from the Taiwan International Cooperation and Development Fund shall not be eligible.
- (5) The graduate student advising fee shall be paid after the student has completed their degree examinations.

Article 3 Funding shall be jointly provided by the College and via the Program’s in-service program cash surplus.

Article 4 These Regulations shall come into effect after they have been approved by the College Affairs Meeting.
